Teddington Theatre Club

Formed in 1927, Teddington Theatre Club (TTC) is now one of the leading amateur drama groups in south west London, performing in their own custom-built theatre in Hampton Hill. Starting out to stage Shakespeare for schools, it soon developed to stage a wide repertoire of plays for the general public, originally to raise funds for its schools programmes.

TTC's first production, in 1927, was *Scenes from Twelfth Night* followed in 1928 with *The Merchant of Ven*ice and *Scenes from As You Like It*. Since then, the Club has gone on to put on over 670 productions and counting as it rapidly approaches its hundredth anniversary. Having performed four or five productions a year in hired halls for many years, in 1969 the Club was granted a lease of part of Richmond Council's Hampton Court House and after two years of conversion work finally opened its own theatre in 1971.

As the lease came towards its end, negotiations with Richmond Council secured a site on Hampton Hill High Street for a new theatre and after a concentrated period of fundraising and with a grant from the National Lottery, the well-equipped Hampton Hill Playhouse (now Theatre) was opened in 1998.

TTC present about ten productions a year and welcome new members - from those who wish to be on stage to the technical teams or front of house. All shows at the Theatre are supported by a huge team of volunteers – so thanks to all of those who have supporting this show with marketing, front of house, bar, health & safety, box office, finance and more.







Biographies

Racheal Rajah - Fairy Daffodil

During her teenage years Racheal had a passion for performing. After moving from Wales to London 12 years ago Racheal made her TTC debut in 2012, performing as Silvia in Privates on Parade. Since then, Racheal has focused on dedicating her time to working within the education sector as a special needs teacher at Dysart School. It wasn't until 10 years later that Racheal returned to the stage, recently playing Mary in TTC's production of Our Country's Good. She's now got the 'acting bug' and looks forward to her first ever panto as Fairy Daffodil - a part that has been adapted to 'leek' some proper Welsh spirit on stage - now isn't that 'tidy'!

Scott Tilley - King Rat

Scott has been a member of TTC for about 10 years on and off and has enjoyed taking part in numerous productions ranging from Panto to Shakespeare. His first play was as the Ghost of Christmas Future in a production of *A Christmas Carol*. His most recent foray was as the panto King in *King Arthur in Space*. Scott is looking forward to treading the boards once more especially to be playing the villain of the piece!





Molly Cole - Jack

Appearing In her TTC debut, Molly is very excited to be fighting her way back to the stage as famous panto character Jack. Although new to the company, Molly is no stranger to the stage, having loved musical theatre from a young age. Dave Dadswell - Baron Hardup/ Barup Ardon

Having been dispatched bloodily in that, he is relieved to be part of something more joyful, although romancing Widow Twankey also has its perils!



Josh Clarke - Prince Charming

Josh has studied theatre and performance from school through college to university and has been a Prince Charming in waiting for as long as he can remember! He joined YAT in 2013 and has been involved in many productions both at HHT and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. He joined TTC in 2017 and his most recent credits include Tony in Abigail's Party and Salty in *Teechers*. Josh can also be found behind the scenes, telling actors where to stand and how to say a line. His directing credits with TTC include The Regina Monologues, Zoo and the Swan Award winning Pornography in 2019. Huzzah!

Caro Hayes - The Glitch

This is Caro's first show with TTC and she's very excited to be playing a character that is a vague step up from the back end of a camel - her initiation into panto as a teenager! She has performed Ensemble shows with BROS over the years from the very sour Mrs. Sowerbury in *Oliver* to bringing the Statue of Liberty to life in *Guys and Dolls*. She's looking forward to strutting her silvery stuff as The Glitch!

Alex Farley - Muddles

Alex is thrilled to be making his TTC return, after playing Stanley and Alf Higginbottom respectively in the two Noel Coward shorts *Still Life* and *Red Peppers* in 2017. His most recent theatrical outings have included playing Friar Lawrence in YATs *Romeo and Juliet*, and codirecting *Robin Hood: The Legend of Bushy Park* alongside Prince Charming himself!

David Hannigan - Widow Twankey

Having enjoyed the role of an Ugly Sister in last year's Cinderella Meets the Monsters. David is delighted to be playing a somewhat more attractive panto icon. He has been performing since he was a teenager and is determined to continue until he gets it right. A member of several local groups, his stage credits range from Shakespeare's Romeo and Julliet to the Lion in *The Wizard of Oz.* As a dame, of course, he particularly eniovs the double entendres and loves the audience interaction which often results in a new script for each performance - Oh yes it does!

Ellie Armstrong - Beauty

Although this is Ellie's first TTC production, this is not her first time on the Hampton Hill stage. With theatre in her blood, Ellie has been performing since the age of four, and upon completing her Acting BA Hons last year, she is back with a BANG! In this show, she is looking forward to proving the famous quote: "though she be but little, she is fierce".

Juliet Manners - Snow White/ Villager/Ensemble

Juliet is no stranger to panto, with her first performance in Puss in Boots at the tender age of nine. She is delighted to be returning to TTC after her debut as a dancer in Cinderella Meets the Monsters last year. Juliet has also made many dancing appearances with BROS, in productions such as Evita at the Minack, 42nd Street at Richmond Theatre and The Producers at HHT. Her last role in Sondheim's Merrilv We Roll Along was especially memorable - she finally got to speak! And now for a quick step ball change...

Leigh Dent - Dorothy/ Smokey/ Ensemble

My Lords, ladies and all the little people sitting in the audience. I have the privilege, nay, the pleasure of introducing you to a Dancer, sired by other Dancers. A dancer who can trace her lineage back beyond Charlemagne. You might have seen her working at the Princes Club, Hampton Court Palace or as a Supporting Artiste on the TV series *The Crown*. I give you Ruby the Fortnite Dancer and Smoky from 3 little pigs, The one... the only Leigh Dent.

Roxanne Ip - Puss in Boots/ Villager/Ensemble

Starting her dancing experience from the age of six, Rox has appeared on stage in ensemble shows from being a Rainbow to the Ivy fairy! Also as a keen singer in ensemble bands and pop choirs, she's now excited to be blending both passions at her first TTC performance in panto. She is literally being kept on her toes and loving every minute!

Naomi Pink - Peter Pan/Villager/ Ensemble

Naomi joined TTC when she performed in the 2019 pantomime production of *King Arthur in Space*. She has also performed at HHT with YAT in their productions of *Our House, Romeo & Juliet* and *Robin Hood*. Naomi has loved musical theatre since a young age and recently performed in *Merrily We Roll Along* with BROS. She regularly teaches musical theatre to aspiring performers with Step On Stage Academy.

Danielle Thompson - Vegan/ Maleficent/Ensemble

Danielle has been an active local theatre performer for 18 years. In the past 18 months she has also "learned the ropes" backstage, as crew on stage management and flying scenery. Her previous roles have included Kristen in Miss Julie, Mrs Morgan the evil villain in the TTC pantomime King Arthur in Space, Hally in Ghost Bell, Mum in Our House the Musical, Fairy Bowbells in Dick Whittington, Winnie in The Matchgirls, Merlot in Cinderella Chester the Jester in Sleeping Beauty and Mother Abbess in The Sound Of Music.

Joanna Taylor - Streaky/Captain Hook/Ensemble

Having attended the Brit School till 2018 and currently at Goldsmiths University, Joanna is keeping her dramatic exploits alive by making her pantomime debut as a member of the ensemble this year. She has been a part of TTC since she performed in the role of Gail in *Teechers* earlier this year.

Zoe Arden - Wicked Witch of the West/Villager/Ensemble

Zoë is thrilled to be back on stage with this terrifically talented panto posse and to again have the honour of delivering the opening line (as her only line, she's had more time to focus on her dance moves and

hopes you notice an improvement!). Previous TTC shows include two Cinderellas most recently as The Narrator, King Arthur in Space, Alice in Billy Liar, Mrs Purkiss in The Matchgirls, the wife in Too Long An Autumn, and a clutch of crazy characters in Under Milk Wood. Other outings include Cynthia in OHADS' The Incident Room, Lily in Cygnet Players' Alfie and as Debbie in Ghost Bell at OSO in Barnes.

Siân Walters - Belatrix Lestrange/ Villager/Ensemble

Siân made her stage debut aged five playing a snowflake and has been involved in all things theatrical ever since! A lover of pantomime she has performed in several for TTC - Snow White, Sleeping Beauty, Dick Whittington, King Arthur in Space and Cinderella Meets the Monsters. Siân has also appeared in Daisy Pulls It Off, the doublebill of Wolf Hall and Bring Up The Bodies, The Killing of Sister George and Pygmalion. In 'real life' she is owned by two cats, drinks too much tea, works in TV-land and is also a member of BROS Theatre Company.



Chris Ferretti - Voice of The Giant

Chris is an actor, playwright and stand-up comedian living in New York. He graduated with an MFA from the Actors Studio through Pace University and subsequently wrote and produced plays throughout the NYC area. Chris performs stand-up in several NY comedy clubs and with his gift for mimicry, is much in demand for voiceover work. He currently resides in Astoria, New York with his lovely wife Julia and moderately insane yorkie, Cosmo.

Daniel Wain - Writer

This is the second panto Daniel has written for TTC, following his much-admired 'Dick' of 2018. A life -long lover of the genre, his behindthe-scenes panto Look Behind You is published by Josef Weinberger (www.josef-weinberger.com). His other scripts include an adaptation of The Marriage of Figaro with Marc Brenner, which premiered at Chiswick's Tabard Theatre and was revived for TTC's 24-hour Valentines online-love-a-thon in February 2021. In September 2021 he directed TTC's first-ever film: Caryl Churchill's Escaped Alone which streamed online. This September, his production company Strut & Fret staged Ben

Brown's Larkin With Women to five -star reviews and sell-out audiences at the Old Red Lion, Islington, with Daniel playing poet Philip Larkin. He has performed many times for TTC and others, returning to panto as Sarah the Cook in Putney Arts Theatre's Dick Whittington next January (www.putneyartstheatre.org.uk), proving you can never get enough Dick!

Nigel Cole - Director

His stage debut in Birmingham as Oliver nearly 50 years ago left Nigel wanting more, so he headed north to Bretton Hall, to study drama. Then London called and TV production, and it was 20 years before he stepped on stage again. Since joining TTC & BROS in 2005, he's made up for lost time, appearing as Rev Hale in The Crucible, Treves in The Elephant Man. Mack Sennett in Mack and Mabel. Franz Leibkind in The Producers and Dysart in Equus. Directing credits include Boy Gets Girl, Privates on Parade, La Cage Aux Folles. The Rise and Fall of Little Voice, Breaking the Code, Pink Mist & Loot.

Lizzie Lattimore - Musical Director

Lizzie has been a member of TTC for some 13 years - her first production being the classic Christmas show The Wizard of Oz (where she shared the stage with two of the wonderful performers you will see today!). It therefore may not be surprising that she revels in helping to stage the yearly Christmas offerings from TTC! Lizzie is often found in ensemble roles on TTC shows and whether it be set design, lighting, sound, stage management, accent coaching or even occasionally on the stage, she always enjoys working as a team to help create powerful professional-standard productions. Lizzie is also a management Trustee of Youth Action Theatre.

Gita Singham-Willis – Choreographer

Gita has been a member of TTC and BROS for more years than she cares to remember and has had the privilege of performing in many musicals including *Thoroughly Modern Millie, Crazy for You* and 42nd Street at Richmond Theatre. She has choreographed several shows such as *Privates on Parade* and *La Cage aux Folles* at HHT, *Mack and Mabel* and *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels* at Minack Theatre. Having made her Panto debut last year as the Count, she couldn't stay away, hoping the

audience have a 'Ball' with her choreography!

Juanita Al-dahhan – Assistant Director

Juanita's creativity and love for the arts spans 30 years, as designer, director, actor and educator coaching students to get into Drama schools. She studied costume design at Wimbledon School of Art, costuming Cats, Oliver Twist. Braveheart and Prince of Thieves, then followed an MA in Acting at ALRA. Favourite parts were the eponymous role in Medea, Viola in Twelfth Night, Dromio of Syracuse in *Comedy of* Errors and Lady Anne in Richard III. She also directed Mother Courage, Three Sisters and Our Country's Good. Since joining TTC, Juanita played Sue in Abigail's Party and has "panto-previous" as the Dame in King Arthur in Space and an Ugly Sister in Cinderella Meets the Monsters.
