From the Director

I am very pleased to finally stage this production, which I've had in mind for a number of years but pulled out of doing for various reasons. It's recognisable, comfortable amusement. This includes the crew, many of whom also come to this off the back of other productions, and I'd like to thank everyone for their energy and enthusiasm, and their patience. Thanks also to the unsung contributors to productions at TTC, such as Roberta and the box office team, lie for her Marketing nudges, and Brian and Anne for keeping us in pocket. And everyone else we may have forgotten!

Anyway, I think everyone has enjoyed the challenge, we've certainly had a good laugh in rehearsals. My only hope now is that our audiences are as amused as we have been throughout. Bon soir, grande amuse, et merci bien!
